DEEPAK RAJ JOSHI APPOINTED CEO OF NTB



Deepak Raj Joshi of has been appointed the new CEO of Nepal Tourism Board (NTB). He will lead the country's national tourism organization for four years. A meeting of the board of directors of NTB held on Thursday selected Joshi for the post. A selection committee had recommended the names of Joshi, Gyanendra Ratna Tuladhar and Gyaneswor Lal Mahato for the post on the basis of their presentation and interview held on Sunday and Monday.

Besides these three candidates, Hari Sarmah, Bishnu GC, Narayan Krishna Pradhan, Raghu Bista, Bhumi Lama and Lok Bahadur Khatri had appeared for the interview. However, three shortlisted candidates -- Subash Nirola, Hum Gurung and Shiva Saran Thapa - hadn't responded to NTB's invitation for interview. The selection committee was led by NTB Board Member Ghanendra Shrestha. Other members of the committee were Ghanashyam Upadhyaya, joint secretary of tourism ministry, NTB Board Member Rajendra Sapkota and two experts -- one each from the government and the private sector.

"At this time, the confidence of tourism industry is very low. My utmost priority will be on raising confidence of the industry. For this, I will bring all players of the industry together," he said adding, "We have huge challenges, but I have plans for faster revival of this industry."

Publishing a notice on December 1, NTB had invited all shortlisted applicants for interview on December 13 and 14. The post of CEO was lying vacant since Prachanda Man Shrestha retired from the post on October 31, 2011.

SAURAHA, POKHARA ANNOUNCE DIFFERENT PROGRAMS TO WOO DOMESTIC TOURISTS

Tourism entrepreneurs of two major tourist destinations -- Chitwan and Pokhara -- are organizing different programs on the occasion of Christmas and New Year to attract domestic tourists. They have been organizing various programs coinciding with Christmas and New Year on a regular basis for the past many years to attract domestic tourists and retain foreign tourists, who normally go back to their respective countries, for Christmas and New Year celebrations.

Regional Hotel Association Nepal (RHAN) Chitwan is organizing 12th edition of Chitwan Elephant Festival in Sauraha from December 26 to 30 and Pokhara Chapter of Restaurant and Bar Association of Nepal (REBAN) is organizing 17th Pokhara Street Festival in Lakeside, Pokhara, from December 28 to January 1. Hotels in Sauraha are offering attractive packages and discount offers during the festival. Hotels associated with RHAN Chitwan are providing 20 percent discount on room tariffs and tourists visiting Chitwan can get rooms at around Rs 1,300. Similarly, tourism entrepreneurs are organizing International Elephant Walk this year instead of Elephant Race.

Similarly, tourism entrepreneurs of Pokhara are providing attractive discounts on food and room tariff during the street festival. Local hotels have already announced 30 percent discount on room tariff, while restaurants are providing 15 percent discount on total bill. The festival is organized on a three-kilometer stretch of Lakeside -- from Khahare to Shahid Chowk.



Nepal to propose China to resume Ktm-Lhasa direct bus service

Nepal is set to propose China for resumption of the direct bus service between Kathmandu and Lhasa when senior tourism officials of the two countries meet here next week after a gap of over 10 years. During the two-day meeting, the officials will discuss on expanding tourism, trade and other facilities in the border area. The much-talked about bus link between the two cities, which was launched in May, 2005, failed to move ahead after 2006 for various reasons, including visa constraints. On May 1, 1994, the two neighbors had signed an agreement on trade and transit, paving the way for the bus service. But it has been suspended for 11 years, said a senior government official privy to the meeting. Once the Araniko Highway is brought back into operation, the bus service can be resumed, according to the official. "Once the highway will be completed with Chinese support, it will widen our tourism and trade prospects," the official said.

Considering the growing number of Chinese tourists in Nepal, China could consider resuming the 14-hour bus service by easing visa restrictions, said the official. China suspended the bus service in 2006 citing security concerns. During the meeting, Nepal will also request the Chinese officials to issue three-day entry permit to non-residents of the bordering districts with China for the promotion of trade and tourism on the Chinese side.

Currently, the Chinese authorities issues only the one-day travel permit to those coming from outside of the bordering districts.


"Due to time constraints, trade and tourism per se, this is not enough for Nepali traders to visit Chinese commercial cities and bordering markets. So we will request the Chinese side to extend the duration of visa also for outsiders to cross the border into the Chinese territory, particularly the Tibet Autonomous Region," said the official, adding that Nepal would called on China also to allow Nepali mountain flights over Manasarovar in Tibet. Hundreds of Nepali tourism entrepreneurs are engaged in sending people on pilgrimage tour to Manasarovar, but they are struggling to conduct mountain flights due to lack of permission from the Chinese side.




