FNCCI asks govt to waive visa fees to boost arrivals

The private sector has asked the government to waive visa fees temporarily to keep Nepal's tourism industry alive as it is close to collapsing after being hit by a series of bad luck this year. "A visa fee exemption for at least six months would be an important move to boost tourist arrivals at a time when tourism, one of the major

contributors to the economy, has been on a downhill course," said Bhawani Rana, senior vice-president of the Federation of Nepalese Chambers of Commerce and Industry (FNCCI), speaking Tuesday at an interaction entitled Tourism in the Present Context. The FNCCI has also recommended making Kathmandu's Tribhuvan International Airport (TIA) cost-effective or a free port to encourage international airlines to pass through here.

The FNCCI has also asked the government to introduce separate incentive packages for tourism entrepreneurs and schemes to attract domestic and foreign investment during this time of crisis.

Binayak Shah, general secretary of Hotel Association Nepal, said that Nepal's tourism industry was facing its most critical phase in almost a decade. From big hotels to small lodges, from international airlines to domestic carriers and from trekking agencies to handicraft shops, all businesses are bearing the brunt of the April 25 earthquake and the subsequent trade embargo by India. "The last time the industry had suffered such big shock was in 2002-03 when the Maoist insurgency was at its height. The conflict had forced nearly a dozen hotels to close down," he said, adding that the current situation was even worse.

The average occupancy of hotels has nosedived to 20 percent. "Hotels in Kathmandu are suffering losses to the tune of Rs100 to Rs120 million daily due to low occupancy and high operating costs."

The ongoing fuel crisis and extended load-shedding hours have increased the operating costs for hotels by 40 percent. Many hotels and restaurants have laid off staff.

Interesting Facts on Christmas

- Santa Claus is based on a real person, St. Nikolas of Myra (also known as Nikolaos the Wonderworker, Bishop Saint Nicholas of Smyrna, and Nikolaos of Bari), who lived during the fourth century. Born in Patara (in modern-day Turkey), he is the world's most popular non-Biblical saint, and artists have portrayed him more often than any other saint except Mary. He is the patron saint of banking, pawnbroking, pirating, butchery, sailing, thievery, orphans, royalty, and New York City.
- Xmas" came into general use from the church! X is the Greek letter Chi, which is the first letter of Christ's name in –so "Xmas" is every bit as religious as "Christmas."
- The traditional three colors of Christmas are green, red, and gold. Green has long been a symbol of life and rebirth; red symbolizes the blood of Christ, and gold represents light as well as wealth and royalty.
- Norwegian scientists have hypothesized that Rudolph's red nose is probably the result of a parasitic infection of his respiratory system.
- Most of Santa's reindeer have male-sounding names, such as Blitzen, Comet, and Cupid. However, male reindeers shed their antlers around Christmas, so the reindeer pulling Santa's sleigh are likely not male, but female or castrati.
- Christmas stockings allegedly evolved from three sisters who were too poor to afford a marriage dowry and were, therefore, doomed to a life of prostitution. They were saved, however, when the wealthy Bishop Saint Nicholas of Smyrna (the precursor to Santa Claus) crept down their chimney and generously filled their stockings with gold coins.
- In Germany, Heiligabend, or Christmas Eve, is said to be a magical time when the pure in heart can hear animals talking.
- Did you know that Coca-Cola was the first company to use Santa Claus in a winter promotion?
- Christmas carols began as an old English custom called "wassailing," in which one would toast their neighbors to a long life. So when you sing Christmas carols, you're bringing joy AND wishing good health to everyone you come across!
- "Jingle Bells" was originally written for a Thanksgiving Celebration.
- A spider web found on Christmas morning is believed to bring good luck in The Ukraine.
- In Norway on Christmas Eve, after holiday dinner and the opening of presents, families hide all the brooms in the house. Norwegians believed in ancient times that witches and mischievous spirits came out on Christmas Eve, and would steal their brooms for riding.
- While not widely celebrated in Japan, fried chicken is often eaten on Christmas day. It is the busiest time of year for restaurants such as KFC and people can even place orders in advance!
- The world's biggest Christmas gift is the Statue of Liberty! Given to the US by the French in 1886, it weighs over 225 tons. It's always stood as a symbol of freedom, but who'd have thought of it as an actual gift?
 - The world's largest Christmas tree was a Douglas Fir standing 221 feet tall! It was displayed at the Northgate Mall right here in Seattle in 1950. We sure know how to do Christmas right in the Pacific Northwest! Can you imagine all the tinsel?
 - The earliest known Christmas tree decorations were apples, used by medieval actors in plays depicting Adam and Eve.
