Limbu delivering his welcome remarks highlighted on some burning issues of the tourism sector, viz., need of Tourist Bus Terminal in the city, the need to improve the physical structure of TIA and consolidation of national flag carrier, amendment in the contradictory definitions of 'tourist' in tourism and transport acts, NATTA demand of certain percentage of NQ Tax, recognition of tourism as national industry, direct representation of tourism related associations in NTB and other tourism bodies/authorities, alternative international airport, and formation of Joint Tourism Coordination Committee etc.

Advisor Mr. Dipendra Purush Dhakal spoke on some of the current trends in Nepalese tourism and said that NATTA was all prepared to lead the private sector industry.

In the meeting President Limbu apprised NTB of NATTA's upcoming promotional campaigns and also revealed that NATTA was soon coming up with a fresh proposal seeking NTB's support to NATTA in ascertaining certain percentage of NQ tax (TSF) to NATTA for promotion and building minor infrastructures in remote touristic areas.
