

#### JTCC SUBMITS MEMORANDUM TO TOURISM MINISTER

Joint Tourism Coordination Committee (JTCC), a forum of 19 travel trade associations, on Tuesday, April 22<sup>nd</sup> handed over a four-point memorandum to the Minister for Culture, Tourism and Civil Aviation Bhim Acharya, drawing the attention of the government toward pressing issues of the Nepali tourism industry. NATTA President, 2<sup>nd</sup> vice president, Treasurer were present while handling the memo



Later in the day, JTCC organized a press meet in Kathmandu to inform media persons about its demands. As a short-term measure to bring about reforms in Nepal Tourism Board (NTB), the associations have asked the government to appoint private sector representatives in the board of NTB on their recommendations. For the long-term solution, the associations asked the government to study report of a taskforce constituted by the tourism minister of the government formed after the people' movement of 2006 and restructure NTB accordingly. The associations have called on the government to launch comprehensive study on plans, programs and expenditure made over the past five years by a team comprising of private sector representatives and auditing experts. The associations also have urged the government to stop National Tourism Fair that NTB is organizing in the near future.



Also regarding the CEO selection process, it is being protracted. "The candidate is removed from the responsibility until the CEO selection process is finalized", the memorandum states. JTCC has said that it won't cooperate with NTB until necessary action is taken in its demands.

#### **NATTA IN SUPPORT OF JTCC**

NATTA jointly with other travel trade organizations have decided not to get involved in any national and international programmes organised by the Nepal Tourism Board (NTB), accusing NTB officials of engaging in massive irregularities of funds collected from tourists.



At a Press Meet on Tuesday, the Joint Tourism Coordination Committee disclosed that NTB's amended

Financial Bylaws have authorised its chief to spend Rs 10 million at a time for tourism promotion inside the country.

NTB, which has been assigned to promote Nepal's tourism in the national and international arenas, has been stumbling along without its head since the then CEO Prachanda Man Shrestha's tenure expired on October 31, 2011.

The private sector has urged the government to immediately implement a report on NTB's restructuring submitted by a government-led team. The private sector has asked the government to immediately appoint a new NTB CEO through a competitive process.

#### **2014 MOUNT EVEREST AVALANCHE**

On Mount Everest near Everest Base Camp killed sixteen Nepalese guides. As of 20 April, thirteen bodies had been recovered. The search for the three remaining bodies was called off due to the difficulty and risk of retrieving them. Some Sherpa guides were angered by the meagre compensation offered by the government to families of the victims and threatened a "strong protest" or strike.

On 21 April, eight of the dead were ceremoniously driven through Kathmandu before being cremated in a Buddhist religious ceremony. <sup>[2]</sup> On 22 April, the Sherpas announced that they would not climb on the mountain during the 2014 season as a mark of respect. <sup>[15]</sup>

On 23 April, the Nepalese government announced that it would give an additional 500,000 Nepali Rs. (approx. US\$5,100) to the families of the dead climbers. Discovery, which cancelled Ogwyn's planned BASE jump shortly after the avalanche struck, announced it would broadcast a documentary about the tragedy. Entitled Everest Avalanche Tragedy, the 90-minute programme will be shown on 4 May. The company also said it would make a donation to the American Himalayan Foundation Sherpa Family Fund, a charity set up to support the families of those who died in the avalanche.

## Five new int'l carriers set to enter Nepali skies

At least five new international airlines plan to connect Kathmandu's Tribhuvan International Airport (TIA) by

Emirates, the largest Middle East airline, plans operate one flight per week with its wide-body aircraft on the Kathmandu sector from October, travel agensector from Corone, travel agen-cies said. The airline, ranked among the top 10 carriers world-wide in terms of passenger kilo-metres in 2012, is holding discus-sions with a Nepali travel agency to appoint a general sales agent.

Myanmar's national flag bearer, Myanmar Airways International, plans to start Nepal operations by September. According to the Civil Aviation

Actoring to the CVI Avianous Authority of Nepal (Caan), Malaysia-based low cost carrier Malindo Air has applied to connect Nepal. Malindo is a joint-venture between Malaysia-based National Aerospace and Defence Industries and Indonesia-based (top Air

TIA statistics show 29 international carriers flew 3.14 million passengers in and out of TIA last year. As new international carriers seek to enter Nepal, those already correction here are also ers seek to enter Nepal, those already operating here are also increasing their frequency to cater to the increased travel demand. Carriers from China have already increased their flight frequency following a recent revision of the ASA. Currently, three Chinese airlines—Air China, China Eastern and China Southern—operate scheduled flights to Nepal. TIA statistics show traveller movement on Chinese carriers jumped by a significant 28 percent to by a significant 28 percent to 187,570 in 2013. The three Chinese airlines received 40,950 more fliers in span of one year. According to Caan, Air China

## Cabinet nod to revise ASA

KATHMANDU: The Cabinet has given the go-ahead to the ministry to revise the ASA with Bhutan following its request as its first private airline. Tashi Air (also known as Bhutan Airlines) plans to conpect Nonal, Nepal and Bhutan Bhutan Airlines) plans to con-nect Nepal. Nepal and Bhutan signed the ASA in February 2004, allowing Bhutan's national flag carrier-Druk Air-to operate seven flights per week between Paro and Kathmandu. The agreement allows only "single designa-tion", and the government plans to provide multiple des-ignation and increasing flight

signed a revised bilateral ASA, permitting the operation of 56 flights per week with any type of flights per week with any type of aircraft on a reciprocal basis. Under the old ASA, Chinese air-lines were allowed to operate 14 flights weekly. Before the ASA, the three Chinese carriers were issued temporary operating permits, allowing them to operate an additional 14 flights per week.

"Increased Nepali travellers, particularly migrant workers, to Malaysia and Middle East sectors has encouraged international carri-ers to raise frequency," said Shyam Raj Thapaliya, managing director of Osho World Travel Nepal. "The number of tourists is also growing (except for the European countries)."
